THE TEXT

1. Ade Adepitan, 44, talks about victory on the basketball court and surviving both polio and prejudice. 'Contracting polio as a baby never stopped me being active. I lost the use of my left leg but I walked to school wearing iron callipers. I also rode a bike and played goalkeeper in football matches'.

2. Ade got in a wheelchair when he started playing basketball for his best team. He left home at 17 because his father thought he was wasting his life on wheelchair basketball. **They** didn't speak for 10 years. Sporting success yet healed his relationship with his dad. Winning bronze at 2004 Athens Paralympic Games and gold at the 2005 Paralympic World Cup in Manchester was special but he was most proud when he was first selected for the 2000 Sidney Paralympics because his dad saw him.

3. Paralympic sport has finally earned public respect. When Ade started out, one man and his dog would watch the games. Now a generation of disabled kids can see **it** as a successful career. 'I have endured so much prejudice; I don't even see it any more. As a child, I remember people making monkey noises at my parents. And because I am in a wheelchair, some people think I don't have a brain. I've learned to **tune it all out**,' said Ade. 'It would be nice to be a father one day; but my wife is at a crucial point in her career, so we will wait. I just want to stay fit enough to see my children excel at sport,' he added.
